Professor Merv Hyde is the Professor and is an active educator and researcher specialising in inclusion and human development in the School of Science, Education and Engineering in the Faculty of Science, Health, Education and Engineering at the University of the Sunshine Coast. Professor Hyde held a number of senior positions at Griffith University, including that of Chair of the Academic Board and is Professor Emeritus at Griffith. At the University of the Sunshine Coast he has been Head of School of Education.

Professor Hyde has been an international University Auditor for over 15 years and is currently on the Register of Experts in Higher Education for the Australian Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA). He is also a research assessor for the Australian Research Council (ARC), Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA), a World Bank and AusAID Technical Consultant and a Board Member for a large EU Project researching and developing the circumstances of immigrants and refugees. He has worked in many nations including Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, USA, Canada, Italy, Ireland, the United Kingdom, Sweden and Norway. He is a highly experienced assessor of both quality indicators and standards compliance.
