

Stenden University of Applied Sciences Qatar welcomes pioneer graduate students

For the first time in its history, Stenden University of Applied Sciences – Qatar (SUAS-Q) welcomed a pioneering batch of graduate students in September, commencing study in one of the two newly accredited postgraduate programmes – a Master's degree in International Leisure, Tourism and Event Management, and a Master's degree in International Hospitality and Service Management.

In addition, the Qatar Ministry of Education and Higher Education has approved the licensure of SUAS-Q's locally accredited Bachelor's degree programmes, making SUAS-Q the first private higher education institution in the State of Qatar licensed to offer its own degrees. This will provide potential students with the opportunity to study for either a dual degree or a locally accredited degree. The dual degree will comprise a Dutch degree awarded by NHL Stenden and a locally accredited degree awarded by SUAS-Q. Students who choose this option will be provided with the opportunity to study in the Netherlands for one (1) year. Students who choose to study in Qatar for the full duration of their programme will be provided with the opportunity to receive a locally accredited degree.

USP School of Tourism and Hospitality Management hosts Sustainable Tourism Development Workshop

A stakeholders' workshop was held at the University of the South Pacific (USP) with the aim of understanding the socioeconomic research needs of Fiji with regard to sustainable development.
