## Associate Professor Rajka Presbury

Associate Professor, Blue Mountains International Hotel Management School (BMIHMS) at Torrens University Australia, Australia



Dr Rajka Presbury came to academe after a successful career in hotel management. She received her PhD in service quality in the hotel sector from Western Sydney University and then joined the academic team to create a Hotel Master's Program. Her research interest has predominantly been in service quality and service experience, exploring perceptions of customers, managers, and employees in hotels. More recently, she become fascinated by the triadic service relationship of educational institutions, corporate service providers and students as current and future employees of the hospitality industry, thus exploring topics such as Work Integrated Learning and Mentoring.

Dr Presbury was awarded the Laureate Australia Professor Sussan Holland Fellowship at Torrens University Australia in 2016-1017. She is also a current Auditor of the Assessment Panel for the International Centre of Excellence in Tourism and Hospitality Education (THE-ICE), which has taken her to Europe and Asia to collaborate with international hospitality programmes and accreditation agencies.

Collaboration with hospitality institutions and hotel employers is a priority in all Dr Presbury's research. She is the research supervisor for four PhD projects, with topics including guest experience in luxury accommodation, leadership for hotel millennials, revenue management strategies in hotels, and digital experiences by tourists.
