Professor Jonathan Powles Pro Vice-Chancellor, University of New England

The UNE have <u>shared lessons</u> from their approach to online exams as institutions around the world work to maintain schedules in a pandemic. Nearly two-thirds of UNE's subjects are already eligible for online examinations, and the university was moving to 100 per cent online exams by the end of the year before COVID-19 saw that deadline rapidly moved forward. Jonathan will discuss how UNE arrived at the

decision to proctor online examinations and how it manages them

Professor Jonathan Powles is Pro Vice-Chancellor (Academic Innovation) at the University of New England where he is responsible for teaching and learning quality, and student, library and information services. At UNE he is currently leading two strategic change programs in the areas of academic innovation and student success.

Prior to joining UNE in June 2017, Professor Powles was Director, Teaching and Learning at the University of Canberra where he led a number of strategic changes in the areas of learning technology, learner analytics, academic development and curriculum innovation. A music academic by background, he has held academic and leadership positions at ANU, and Liverpool Hope University in the UK, always with a focus on teaching and learning quality and innovation. His scholarly and programmatic interests are in the areas of professional learning, the affordances of learning technologies, social media and social learning, and the educational trajectories of diverse learners in modern higher education. He completed his undergraduate education at the University of Sydney, where he studied composition with Peter Sculthorpe and Ross Edwards, and his D Phil at the University of Oxford.
