Professor Clive Smallman (PhD FBCS CITP GAICD) is a highly experienced educator, author, mentor, education executive and entrepreneur. He is presently Dean and Senior Advisor, Higher Education Leadership Institute (an Australian virtual higher education provider), and Managing Director, Professor Clive Smallman (his private practice consulting firm). He is also Adjunct Professor of Management, Western Sydney University (Australia) and an advisor to a range of higher education providers in Australia.

With an h-index of 27, Professor Smallman is an active researcher with 100 plus peer review publications and book chapters, including a highly cited article in the prestigious *Academy of Management Journal*. He has supervised 17 doctorates to completion and over 120 master projects. He has held three multi-million dollar research grants, including one in tourism yield management from the New Zealand Foundation of Research Science and Technology. Professor Smallman has published four books.

He is formerly President and PEO, Asia Pacific International College (Sydney, Australia), Assistant Vice-Chancellor and Dean of Business at Western Sydney University (Australia), Professor of Business Management, Lincoln University (New Zealand), Senior Research Associate and James Tye/British Safety Council Fellow, Judge Business School, Isaac Newton Trust Teaching Fellow and Director, Hughes Hall, both University of Cambridge (UK), Senior Lecturer University of Bradford Management School (UK). Clive has also previously held commercial artificial intelligence research and development positions with leading UK brands.

Clive's PhD in operational risk management is from the University of Bradford School of Management. He is a Chartered Fellow of the British Computer Society and Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors.
