




Resilience defined



What is resilience? One of the earliest resilience models is from C. F. "Buzz" Holling, an ecologist, proposed the theory of resilience which emphasized the interdependence of systems of society, economies, and the environment. (Cochrane, 2015).



Resilience Defined







Another theory of resilience distinguishes that there are different types of resilience. (Twigger-Ross et al., 2011):

- Resilience as resistance holding the line, preparing for the last disaster.
- Resilience as bounce-back getting back to normal.
- Resilience as adaptation adjusting to a new normal...accepting that your world has changed which should ensure that vulnerabilities are not reproduced.
- ▶ Resilience as transformation-transforming to meet future threats. Radical change (physical, social, psychological, economic) in the face of current or future hazards owned by individuals and communities (of all types).
